Cold Blood: The Antarctic Murders Trilogy


It has been more than 50 years since scientist and novelist Theodore J. (Ted) Cohen spent four months on the North Antarctic Peninsula. There, he and a colleague conducted scientific studies throughout the 1961-62 Austral summer. Many times in those intervening years Cohen thought about the harrowing experiences that almost cost them their lives as they moved among their various work sites on the Peninsula, the nearby offshore islands, and the Chilean bases in the South Shetland Islands.



"I started writing this story in 1962 while in the Antarctic. There, I developed the material as a shortstory intended for submission to Playboy magazine. Somehow, the manuscript, which only existed in handwritten form on the back of some blank radiograms, was lost on my return trip to the United States. What with graduate studies, marriage, the Army, and starting a family and career, the whole idea of capturing our unusual experiences in a fictional piece simply faded away . . . until late in 2009. Then, the idea to begin writing again occurred to me as I was going through old 35mm slides that I was having converted to digital format."

The story was published as the Antarctic Murders Trilogy in 2010 by AuthorHouse. It comprises, first, Frozen in Time: Murder at the Bottom of the World (Book I), which describes what happened following the robbery of the Banco Central de Chile in Talcahuano in May, 1960. Unfinished Business: Pursuit of an Antarctic Killer (Book II) reveals the events that unfolded between March 1962 and March 1965. End Game: Irrational Acts, Tragic Consequences (Book III), brings the series to a close, revealing the secrets to most but not all of the mysteries surrounding these thrillers. "Now I've decided to publish the three books together in one (Kindle) eBook," said Cohen, "after several people said they would have liked to have had access to all three novels in a single volume. At this point it was just a matter of taking the original source material and stringing it together. The book came together quickly. I've also priced it aggressively to ensure everyone can enjoy it."

Other books by Theodore Jerome Cohen include *Night* Shadows, a novel involving teenage rape and suicide, and bad decisions that come back to haunt you later in life, and *Lilith: Demon of the Night*, a novel about a New York City vampire cult, and House of Cards: Dead Men Tell No Tales, which is based on real events related to the 2008 financial crisis precipitated by the housing bubble. An earlier novel of the same genre, Death by Wall Street: Rampage of the Bulls, focused on corruption within the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the incompetence of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). Dr. Cohen's first novel, Full Circle: A Dream Denied, A Vision Fulfilled, which is based on his life as a violinist, was published in 2009. Screenplays penned by Dr. Cohen include Death by Wall Street based on his novel by the same name, and Beware Those Closest, based on his novel House of Cards. Finally, Dr. Cohen has



published more than 450 papers, articles, columns, essays, and interviews, and is a coauthor of *The* NEW *Shortwave Propagation Handbook* (from CQ Communications). The author's financial writings may be found on the Website *SeekingAlpha.com*.
